WHEREAS, local, state, federal, and non-profit organizations across our arid state have partnered to accomplish this by creating and promoting a statewide, annual water awareness campaign that has informed and empowered citizens and businesses to be efficient and mindful of their water use and protection of water quality; and

WHEREAS, in this time of increasingly limited water supplies and uncertainty, more must be done by all Arizonans to conserve, protect, and secure the state's water supplies for the future; and

WHEREAS, information, education, awareness, and engagement are fundamental to ensuring that citizens, businesses, visitors, and elected officials remain mindful, committed stewards of this vitally important shared resource; and

WHEREAS, water managers and elected officials will be called upon to make difficult policy decisions to protect Arizona's water and ensure the state's water future and will need support from all water users.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Katie Hobbs, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim the month of April as

WATER AWARENESS MONTH

calling on Arizona's water agencies and stakeholders to capitalize upon this momentum to increase awareness of water issues, promote engagement and immediate action by all water users, and build support for regional, interagency, and basin-wide solutions to ensure a sustainable water future for Arizona.
